Competitions

MBA are experiencing a tremendous amount of growth within our domestic competition, sharing a facility with other sports at the Mildura Sporting Precinct (MSP) requires us to fit in with the prescribed court allocation there. MSP management have made some changes to our court allocations for the summer 2024-25 season therefore we are required to make some minor changes to last year's nights of play.

These nights are subject to change should entries reach a level that an age group not be able to be accommodated on the advertised night due to court availability.

Competition games will start from 4:20pm and last game could be scheduled for 9:20pm depending on the night and age groups with younger age groups first.

The season will commence on Monday 14th October, junior competition runs in line with the Victorian Public-school terms. There will be no games played on Melbourne Cup Day, Australia Day or Labour Day.

Venues

The main venue for the MBA summer competition will be the Mildura Sporting Precinct on Deakin Avenue. Subject to entries one or more divisions may be played at the Mildura Hothouse on Eighth Street.

Registrations

All players are required to be registered prior to taking the court in any MBA domestic competition. Only registered games will count towards MVP votes and qualification for finals.

Independent Team and Game Night Costs

Senior Social Player Registration \$50 per person on registration

Under 8 Game night fee \$6.50 per game

Junior Game night fee (U10 – U19) \$12 per game

Senior Game night fee \$14 per game

All team entry and game night payment structures include:

- Competition Court Hire
- Competition Administration
- Competition Operations
- Provision of Game Day Referees, Supervisors and Development Programs

Our Clubs set their season fees independent of the association and will communicate their season costs to their members separate to this information.

Basketball Victoria Annual Participation License Fee

This is a statewide participation license that applies to domestic, tournament and junior representative player registrations and is charged when the player doesn't already have a license that covers them for the entirety of the season they are registering to.

Cost:

- \$29.00 per player for Junior (17 and under) annually / 365 days
- \$43.00 per player for Senior (18 and over) annually / 365 days



Player Insurance

As part of registering within the MBA, all players are covered under Basketball Victoria insurance policy. If a player needs to make a claim, they can visit the below site:

Team Pay App for game night payments.

MBA utilise TeamPay to collect and manage match fees and forfeits. TeamPay is an APP sports use to collect, manage and report on payments from individuals. Your game night fee is required to be paid before you take the court.

The MBA no longer accepts cash for game night payments. If you are unable to utilise the TeamPay APP, please see game night staff in the first instance to organise payment on game night using EFTPOS. Alternate payment methods will only be accepted if approved by MBA management. There will be an option to pay for the season in full, you will be required to complete the application form for this, which can be found on our website policies page.

TeamPay will also be used to manage forfeit submissions for senior teams. If your team is unable to play, a forfeit is to be submitted via your TeamPay APP. Once a forfeit has been submitted by the appointed organiser TeamPay sends an email notification to MBA which triggers a push notification to the nominated contacts of the teams affected.

Forfeit Fee payments.

The MBA has set costs related specifically to running competition night which include court hire fees to the Mildura Sporting Precinct for all fixtured games in the season, referee and night supervisor payments. Any team that provides less than 24 hours' notice of a forfeit will be required to pay the appropriate forfeit fee for their age group:

- Junior teams \$75
- Senior Teams \$95



Clubs will be invoiced for their teams. Social teams will have the charge added to TeamPay and team contacts will be able to determine whether the fee is distributed amongst members or paid by an individual. The fee will need to be paid before your next game to enable game night payments to be made.

Fixtures & Results

Once registered, the fixture and results can be found on our website using the domestic Fixtures/Results tab.

Fixture Requests

- Coaches of multiple teams will be accommodated (no games clash where possible).
- Players in multiple teams, permanent specific games time requests and team manager requests will be considered but are not guaranteed to be accepted.
- Fixture requests of any kind to be provided to the Competitions Manager with a minimum of 7 days' notice to be considered.

Finals Eligibility

To be eligible to play finals a player must have taken the court and played at least 40% of scheduled games for that team within the season as a registered player, including grading games. This season the MBA will be utilising the functionality in Play HQ to manage this. If you do not meet these requirements, you will not be able to be added to the team sheet during finals.

Domestic Club Clearances

MBA will utilise the electronic transfers function within PlayHQ. Participants will need to submit a clearance form as with previous years to nominate their two preferred club options. These requests will be discussed at the designated clearance meetings.

By the MBA utilising the transfer function in Play HQ if a player tries to register with a new club, they will be informed that they require a transfer and if the Clearance has not already been submitted it will trigger the process.

Referee Program

The MBA Referee Program has grown the number of officials since the return from COVID. This is due to the hard work of our Director of Participation and Development, but we still have a way to go to ensure all games are fully resourced. As the number of teams entering increases so does the need for more referees.

If you are interested in becoming a referee, you can find more information on the referee page of our website REFEREES | mildura-basketball (mildurabasketballassociation.com.au) or see one of the MBA staff on competition night. The MBA provides a nominal contribution in line with Basketball Victoria recommendations for all games refereed.

MBA currently have another group of officials working through a beginner course and you can expect to see more green shirt referees on the court again once we settle into the summer season. MBA is working towards having qualified referee supervisors available most nights to assist the referees in their development, this is a crucial aspect to our referee program.

It is important we all play our part in helping our referees develop by allowing them to referee the game. If you have queries on game days, a coach or player may politely speak to a referee. Spectators are not to approach referee's and must adhere to the Spectator Code of Conduct. If you have concerns during a game, please approach the game night supervisor to come and watch the game. Failure to adhere to the codes of conduct may result in disciplinary action.



Scoring

Every team (U10 and above) must provide at least one scorer for each game.

There are two roles on the score bench:

- 1. The game clock. This is the visual for players, spectators, and coaches to see score.
- 2. The electronic scoring device. This is the official tracking, and where results are submitted at the end of each day. It important the device is correct upon completion of the game.

Between the two people on the bench, they will need to determine who will manage the directional arrow. One can take responsibility for the whole game, or they could do this for a half each.

Results

Results will upload to our PlayHQ site once the game is ended correctly on the iPad. Sometimes there are issues with the Wi-Fi and if this does not happen on the night MBA staff will ensure all results are loaded prior to competition commencement the following day.
